- **Fort Carlton:** Fort Carlton was an important hub for the Hudson's Bay Company (HBC) from 1810 1885. Located on the North Saskatchewan River and with easy access by land, this site was an ideal place to warehouse goods and gather provisions for other posts. An important negotiation site for Treaty Six in 1876, Fort Carlton was accidently burned down during a hasty evacuation that took place during the Northwest Resistance of 1885. https://www.tourismsaskatchewan.com/provincialpark/1809/fort-carlton-provincial-park
- <u>Duck Lake Museum</u>: Experience life from days gone by at the Duck Lake Regional Interpretive Centre from the every day struggles of the Pioneers, to the devastating impact that the near extinction of the buffalo had on the First Nations, and to the harsh aftermath of the North West Resistance for the Metis. <u>http://www.ducklakemuseum.com/</u>
- Batoche National Historic Site: Journey back in time to talk with a 19th century Métis settler about life on the banks of the South Saskatchewan River. Imagine the shocking changes as the troops and warriors gathered and battle began to rage.
