

Minutes of February 28, 2012 Meeting

(Next meeting is on March 27, 2012, 7:30 pm) 2012 MEMBERSHIP FEES ARE NOW <u>PAST</u> DUE. \$75.00 PER MEMBER!

President Norm called the meeting to order @ 7:31 PM.

There were 2 guests this evening: Hershel Smith – 57 GMC $\frac{1}{2}$ ton & Bill Wilson- 50 Ford. Welcome!

Norm asked if there were any errors or omissions for the minutes of the January 2012 meeting. One was noted earlier – incorrect date listed in January minutes of the November meeting. None other was indicated. The minutes were M/S by, Ray Graves/Lloyd Morgan, carried.

TREASURE'S REPORT

Paul Collyer gave the treasurer's report which included an accounting of all bank accounts. Paul also indicated that 39 membership fees were still outstanding. Acceptance of the Treasures report was M/S by Paul Collyer/Ray Graves.

Paul also asked for a Motion from the Membership asking to change the Signing Authority for the club. The motion indicated that Jim Lauritzen be removed from Signing Authority, Bud Small and Norm Mowles be added as Signing Authority and Paul Collyer and John Boehmer remain on as signing Authority. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Norm indicated that he still requires 3 more cars for the Draggin's car show April 6 & 7. Please let him know ASAP if you would like to display with the club.

A signup sheet went around to fill door security spots at the Draggin's show. Anybody who signs up will get free admission to the show and if you have a car in the show it would be appreciated if you help out as well. (By the end of the meeting many spots remained so if you can help out please let Norm know)

Norm welcomed the new incoming Executive and thanked the outgoing group for their hard work.

Norm indicated that a letter had been sent to City Park Collegiate indicating that we would not be funding a bursary at the school as our 5 year commitment was finished. We have received a letter from SIAST indicating we are giving out a Bursary there that is worth \$500.00, and because it is aimed at a student in financial need the government would match for a grand total of \$1000.00

Norm spoke on the Ditch Clean. Our commitment to the Highways Department Expires this May and the club will still need to do one more ditch clean under the agreement. He also looked for feedback on whether we should renew our commitment or not. Ken Johnson spoke and felt that we should not renew as we never get enough people out to do it. Ray Fribance felt that we should continue as we are in the car hobby, drive the highways and can contribute to cleaning them. If we don't get enough people out we just don't finish the last kilometer or so. If you have feedback please let one of the Directors know your feelings. Further discussion will be held at the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Ray Graves spoke in regard to the Derby Car as Bob McGuire is in the USA meeting with the Derby family to get additional first hand information. Ken Johnson has volunteered to lead the Interior part of the project and Gerald Prefontaine will be leading the Bodywork portion of the project.

The AGM was discussed, specifically moving the date of the AGM to, possibly November. This came about because many people are gone for the winter and can't attend, the Barrett Jackson Auction was the same night and weather may be a factor. Currently out of close to 90 members we are getting about 40 out for the AGM. Norm indicated that an amendment to the Club Bylaws would need to take place. After a discussion a show of hands was asked for to either change to November or keep in January, but move one way or the other by a week and overwhelmingly hands went up to the "keep in January but move it by a week. Another show of hands was asked for to see how many people didn't care either way and that ended up being the biggest show of hands.

Norm read an email in regard to a fundraiser for Bert McLeay's wife Darlene who was severely injured in an accident. He has also been working on a list of all members since inception of the club, indicating that Cec Wheaton was the first member. He hopes that the Derby Car will be finished at that time and can be unveiled to the media at our anniversary.

Lloyd Minion and Mike van Grondelle will be working on updating the members section of the website in the upcoming months as it is out of date. They will be looking for current members to send in updated information and pictures in the near future. Norm handed out two new members packages to Brian Domney and Blake Wiggins, who have also joined the Executive.

Fred Remillard spoke about the club By-Laws and that they are still under revision and will be done soon.

He also indicated that there was a very interesting exhibit at the Kenderdine Gallery at the University of Saskatchewan. On display are a full size V8 engine, transmission, starter and carburetor made out of Ceramic. It is very interesting to see.
