The house was originally built in Hanley in 1906 and moved to the acreage by the previous owner in the 1970's. The car was rather a spontaneous purchase without much research I'm afraid and we do not have any experience with car restoration.


And once we brought the car home we realized how complete it seems to be and the trunk is full of parts. So we have not yet decided whether to use it in the yard or if it is worth being fully restored.





